SOLEMNITY OF THE BODY AND BLOOD-CORPUS CHRISTI (Cycle B)

Exodus 24:3-8 Psalm 116:12-13, 15-18 Hebrews 9:11-15 Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

JUST DO IT

"This is My blood, the blood of the covenant, to be poured out on behalf of many." –Mark 14:24

When Moses read to the chosen people the words of the covenant with the Lord, the people responded "with one voice, "We will do everything that the Lord has told us' " (Ex 24:3). The next day, they reiterated: "All that the Lord has said, we will heed and do" (Ex 24:7). They understood that doing was an essential part of the covenant. Jesus Himself at the Last Supper said, "Do this as a remembrance of Me" (Lk 22:19), when He said: "This cup is the new covenant in My blood" (Lk 22:20). Therefore, let us do the covenant by:

•doing the Eucharist in memory of Him (1 Cor 11:24),

•doing for the least of the brethren (Mt 25:40),

•doing whatever He tells us (Jn 2:5), and

•doing "everything that the Lord has told us" (Ex 24:3).

When we began the Easter season, the Lord through His Church called us to renew our baptismal covenant. The Church asked us: "Do you reject Satan, all his works, and all his empty promises?" and "Do you believe in the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit?" We repeatedly answer these questions: "I do." Do the covenant. Do it in memory of Jesus.

Prayer: Father, make me a missionary of the Eucharist so as to lead as many as possible to Eucharistic love and worship.

Promise: "...how much more will the blood of Christ, Who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself up unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God!" –Heb 9:14

Praise: "All praise and all thanksgiving be every moment thine." Praise be Your precious Blood, Lord Jesus.

JUNE 2: CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION TO ST. MARY OF THE ASSUMPTION: Starting at 11 AM, the pilgrims will enter Park City on the Rail Trail and head towards the historic Old Town Chapel (121 Park Avenue, Park City). Adoration will happen from 1 - 2 PM, followed by a massive 4-mile Eucharistic procession from the chapel to the main church (1505 White Pine Canyon Road, Park City). Bishop Oscar Solis will say Mass at 5:30 PM, immediately followed by a dinner and celebration at 7 PM. Click here for more info.

JUNE 3: DOWNTOWN SALT LAKE CITY: On June 3, there will be a procession from the Cathedral of the Madeleine to the St. Catherine of Siena Newman Center. Mass and dinner will follow. Times TBD.

JUNE 4: UINTA BASIN EVENTS: Next, the pilgrimage will continue down to the Fort Duchesne Reservation Community with a procession at 10 AM. Mass will follow at 11:30 AM. In the afternoon, stick around for events on the historic Ute Tribe and Hispanic communities. St. Helen's in Roosevelt will host lunch at 1 PM and a Rosary at 3:30 PM. At 5 PM, there will be an evening procession from USU Vernal to St. James Catholic Church.

JUNE 5: LITURGIES IN VERNAL: The final morning will start with Mass at St. James in Vernal at 8:30 AM followed by Adoration. Then, there will be a final breakfast before the pilgrims continue on to Colorado.
