My only strength, the Eucharist

"Were you able to celebrate Mass in jail?" is a question many have asked me countless times. And they are right: the Eucharist is the most beautiful prayer, the summit of the Christian life. When I answer yes, I already know what the next question will be: "How did you manage to get bread and wine?" When I was arrested, I had to leave immediately, empty-handed. The next day, I was allowed to write and ask for the most basic necessities: clothes, toothpaste... I wrote to my destitute: "Please send me some wine as medicine for a stomach ache." The faithful understood what that meant: they sent me a small bottle of altar wine with a label that read: "medicine for a stomach ache," and they hid the hosts in a torch used to combat dampness. The policeman asked me: "Does your stomach hurt?" Yes, here is some medicine for you.

Every day, with three drops of wine and one drop of water in the palm of my hand, I celebrated Mass. It depended on the situation, though. On the ship that took us north, I celebrated Mass at night and gave Communion to the prisoners around me. Sometimes I had to celebrate when everyone went to the bathroom after exercise. In the re-education camp, we were divided into groups of 50; we slept in communal beds; each of us was entitled to 50 centimeters. We managed to have five Catholics with me. At 9:30 p.m., the lights had to be turned off, and everyone had to sleep. I would crouch down in bed to celebrate Mass from memory and distribute Communion by passing my hand under the mosquito net. We made little pouches from cigarette packs to keep the Blessed Sacrament. I always carried the Eucharistic Jesus in my shirt pocket.

I spent nine years in isolation. During that time, I celebrated Mass every day around 3 p.m., the hour when Jesus was agonizing on the cross. I was alone, and I could sing my Mass however I wanted—in Latin, French, Vietnamese... I always carried with me the small bag containing the Blessed Sacrament. These were the most beautiful Masses of my life. In the evenings, between 9 and 10 p.m., I spent an hour in adoration, singing Laudato Sion, Pange Lingua, Adoro Te, Te Deum, and songs in Vietnamese. I felt a great peace of mind and heart, the joy of serenity and the company of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. I sang Salve Regina, Salve Mater, Alma Redemptoris Mater, Regina Coeli... in unity with the Universal Church. Despite the accusations and slander against the Church, I sing Tu es Petrus, Oremus pro Pontifice nostro, Christus vincit... Just as Jesus calmed the hunger of the multitude that followed him in the desert, in the Eucharist He Himself continues to be the food of eternal life" (Card. F. X. Nguyen van Thuan, *Five Loaves and Two Fish*, pp. 40-43).

Loving Under Pressure

In the article "Loving Under Pressure" the author Jack Calcutt explains that the way families respond to stressful situations is more important than the stressful situations themselves. Through the example of getting his children ready for Sunday Mass, he explains that arguments, yelling, and frustration often make problems worse instead of solving them. He admits that he and his wife have made mistakes by reacting with anger, but they have learned that staying calm and controlling their own emotions helps them guide their children more effectively. The author encourages parents to take care of themselves first so they can think clearly, focus on helping one child at a time, and give extra attention to the youngest or those who need the most support. He believes that these simple actions create a more peaceful and loving atmosphere at home, even during busy or chaotic moments. Ultimately, the author wants readers to understand that love is shown through patience, kindness, and serving others, especially when life is difficult. By practicing these habits every day, families can build stronger relationships, reduce conflict, and better live out their Christian faith. He concludes that learning to love one another under pressure not only helps families work together but also prepares them to worship God with a more peaceful and united heart.
